Subject: WIPP actions to obtain regulatory approval of HUFPP and CCC as waste containers eligible for disposal at WIPP

Randy:

I asked our Regulatory Affairs group to describe the process for seeking approval of the HUFPP and CCC as waste containers at WIPP. The attached is a rather wordy version (to ensure completeness) of what we came up with. I don't know if this discussion needs to be captured in your DEIS, but on our telecon on Tuesday, we offered to develop a brief description of how we would go about seeking regulatory approval - similar to the white paper we developed on how WIPP would help DOE HQ obtain an NRC license under 10CFR71 (in addition to DOE's existing license).

Remember, we are already starting the CCC process. We might even be shipping in the CCC in 2012 (from other sites), so it will already have undergone the regulatory gauntlet before the SPD EIS ROD. On the other hand, the HUFPP may require special equipment (for handling and potential safeguards requirements). We wouldn't start the regulatory change process to bring these new things for HUFPP disposal under our regulatory umbrella until a ROD was in hand.
