The two hemispheres were received from the metallurgists Monday afternoon, July 2. These hemispheres contained slightly more material than previously requested and do not seem to meet specifications on the polar height which varies considerably from the equatorial diameter. Actual measurements are given below:

The test of criticality was continued Tuesday morning, and the second plate was inserted. After lunch, the assembly was run critical while I was here by removing the top Cd hemisphere. Not all of the simulated H.E. could be put in under these conditions.

After this assembly, long discussions with Smith, Jette, Kirby and Morrison occurred to try to figure out what to do about the appearance of blisters on the flat, equatorial surface. Careful measurements were taken of the contours of certain regions of the hemispheres to ascertain whether these were changing appreciably. [The origin of these blisters is not known, but it seems likely to be associated with the plating process since the flat side is up.] The sphere seems to be acceptable on dimensional grounds at the present time, but one worries about any greater separation along the equatorial plane. If no further change occurs, it will probably be used in its present form. [It may, however, be replated in case it is believed a better job can be done.] As a dire extreme an investigation is being made to see whether the assembly could be stripped along the equatorial surface and assembled unprotected on this plane. This would be somewhat hazardous, although probably adequate protection could be maintained for health with a thin layer of grease. The decision on procedure will be made just prior to finishing the safety and engineering tests which should be through by Thursday noon.

He promised that he would do this.

This directive will tell us what our responsibilities are regarding production and state that we will obtain long range schedules directly from Oppe. I had pointed out to Oppe that there were two kinds of schedules—one long range, the other essentially a short range schedule which we expect to get in the future from Metallurgy, which will tell us when we are getting an assembly from say, the 16th of the month to the 19th of the month. The main thing, however, that we need for planning is a schedule which will tell us what to figure about for two months hence. A further part of the directive will contain a statement of what our aims should be on the development of the levitated sphere gadget and what sort of schedule we ought to hold to for that, what we should do in the handling of active assembly and what we ought to do at essentially differential research in the study of implosion.

I pointed out to Oppe that I realized it was a very difficult thing for him to furnish at the present time, due to the great uncertainty in what our directive from Washington will be regarding the type of gadgets that we will be making. However, I think that in view of the fact that we are not getting this point settled very quickly, it would be much better if we did get a directive, even at the risk of having it changed in a few weeks. There seems to be unnecessary division from topside on these matters.
