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

Schlimme: Prior to your going ever on this first trip, had you received any type of, uh, counterintelligence briefing about what to expect there, or what to look out for.

Schlimme: Do you recall the details, though? Who may have given you that?

Frazier: No, I, I'm not sure I recall the details, but, uh, I'm sure it would have been the same EG&G person that probably did the debrief after we ....

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
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
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Frazier: I, I think it still developing. I haven't been involved much in it.

Schlimme: Yeah.


Frazier: Um, they, they came over and he and Chad and I were involved in a discussion with him about how he could get over here.


