





Review your profile through the System for Award Management @ [www.sam.gov](http://www.sam.gov) regularly. In addition, make sure that your vendor information in the General Services Administration's eLibrary is accurate and up-to-date -- you will be glad that you did.



## ACQUISITIONS CHANGE. STAY INFORMED.

DOE and NNSA rely upon Fedconnect ([www.fedconnect.net](http://www.fedconnect.net)) and the Federal Business Opportunities website ([www.fbo.gov](http://www.fbo.gov)) to provide information including synopses of proposed contract actions, solicitations, and modifications. Register for an account and stay informed.

## OUR PROMISE TO YOU

The NNSA is committed to providing maximum practicable contracting opportunities to small businesses (as defined in the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Part 19.201) for goods and services needed to support program and mission accomplishment.

All NNSA non-Management & Operating contract actions shall be reserved for small businesses. Non-M&O contract awards to large businesses require an approved Small Business Waiver prior to making an award.

All small business subcontracting plans as identified in the FAR Subpart 19.7 and the Department of Energy Acquisition Regulation (DEAR) Subpart 970.19 shall include goals that will challenge contractors to expand small business use.
