Both of these entities are dedicated to trying to recycle or divert as much waste from the landfill as possible, thereby decreasing the amount of materials coming in labeled as C+D. A little more explanation we consider C+D to be construction material brought in that is not source separated and therefore cannot be diverted as is sent to the landfill. Other materials associated with C+D such as metal and concrete that are brought in separately are not included in the C+D number provided because the materials is diverted.

In 2009, the Eco Station excepted 6,042 tons of C+D and recycled 7,289 tons of concrete (most of which you can assume was from construction projects). The County sent 16,241 tons of MSW to the landfill. A total of 35,285 tons of material was landfilled, recycled or beneficially used.
